

Stevens Creek Blvd Class IV Bike Lane Phase 2A Project



As part of the City's Capital Improvement Program, construction on Phase 2A of the Stevens Creek Boulevard Class IV Bike Lane Project will begin September 15, 2025, and is expected to finish by year-end. Work will take place between Wolfe Road and De Anza Boulevard and may cause traffic impacts and delays.

The project will convert existing buffered bike lanes into separated lanes with concrete barriers, add exclusive bicycle signals at Wolfe and De Anza, and renovate the eastbound bus stop east of De Anza to include a boarding island. Golden Bay Construction will serve as general contractor, with Consor Engineers providing construction management.

MEETINGS AND RESIDENT CONCERNS

Meeting with Concerned Resident

This week, Interim Deputy City Manager Kirsten Squarcia and I met with a concerned resident following a letter submitted in person regarding a neighboring red-tagged property. The letter outlined issues related to potential occupancy, noise, and safety. Staff is actively following up with the appropriate departments, including Code Enforcement, to ensure the matter is addressed in accordance with City codes and procedures.

Encampment Near The Habit

Staff received a resident report regarding junk and debris on the sidewalk near The Habit on Stevens Creek Boulevard. The location was identified as an encampment belonging to an unhoused individual. City staff is working closely with Santa Clara County and West Valley Community Services, who have already begun outreach to offer resources and conduct their assessment. If the situation does not improve, the City will proceed with the abatement process.



Meeting with SVCS on Language and Culture Class

On Friday, Administrative Services Director Kristina Alfaro, Human Resources Manager Vanessa Guerra, and I met with representatives from the Silicon Valley Chinese School and TECO to discuss a proposal for an eight-week Chinese language and culture class for interested City or library employees. The conversation focused on exploring opportunities for the City to participate in this potential offering.
