GENERAL UPDATES

Community Tree Lighting

Together, we kicked off the holiday season as the tree came alive with hundreds of twinkling lights, filling the plaza with a magical glow. City Manager's Office Recognition



During the December 2 Council meeting, staff from the City Manager's Office were invited forward to receive a proclamation recognizing their dedication, collaboration, and service to the organization and community. Our team remains committed to working together with integrity, accountability, and a shared focus on supporting the City's mission and advancing Council priorities.

Living Safely with Coyotes Community Meeting

On December 1, residents attended a Living Safely with Coyotes community meeting hosted in partnership with the University of California Agriculture and Natural Resources and the Santa Clara County Mosquito and Vector Control District. The event recognized local businesses and community members, as well as Christina Lopez from Parks Department and provided an opportunity to connect with attendees and support the Chamber's annual celebration.







Photovoltaics Project Begins December 8

The City will begin construction on its Photovoltaics Project on December 8, with work occurring at the Quinlan Community Center in the Alves parking lot, the Cupertino Sports Center parking lot and the roof of Community Hall. From December 8 through December 24, construction fencing will be installed in the Alves parking lot and Cupertino Sports Center parking lots, in the designated areas shown on the maps. During this period, parking will not be available in these locations. Construction activity will also take place on the roof of Community Hall, temporarily affecting seven adjacent parking spaces.

City Hall Closed Temporarily on December 9

City Hall offices, including the <u>Permit Center</u>, will be closed on Tuesday, December 9, from 11:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. due to a citywide meeting.

Regular operations and hours will resume at 1:30 p.m.





New Sticker Permits Starting 2026

Beginning in 2026, the City will introduce an optional vinyl sticker parking permit for employees as an alternative to the existing placard system. This change is intended to improve visibility for enforcement staff and reduce citations where placards may not be displayed. Vinyl stickers will also be available to Councilmembers who prefer this option.

Cupertino Business Outreach Program



On Thursday, December 4, 2025, staff visited local businesses at the Marketplace Shopping Center as part of the City's Cupertino Business Outreach Program (CBOP). Cupertino High School Students' Permit Instruction Videos

Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) Cupertino students from High School completed their school project on identifying potential improvements to the City's permitting process by creating a two-part video. El Camino Health submitted a building permit application to renovate their 20,545-square-foot office building located at 19400 Stevens Creek Boulevard. The project valuation listed on their application is \$3.5 million, and the business purchased the vacant property this summer for \$10.4 million.
